GENERAL POLICIES

The following regulations pertain to more than one activity, and therefore are included at the beginning of the Region 6 Activity Manual. Specific regulations for each sport or activity will be found with the region schedule for that activity. It is the responsibility of all principals, coaches, moderators and participants to become thoroughly familiar with these regulations.

1. ADMISSION FEES AND TICKETS

- A. \$4.00 Visiting high school students with activity cards and other school age children
- B. \$5.00 Adults and high school students without activity card
- C. \$15.00 Family Pass, six person (two adult) maximum. ALL must be present at the time of entry.
- D. Pre-season games are the same as A and B above.
- E. Home games are free to home students with activity card.
- F. Free to holder of Region 6 and UHSAA (Utah High School Activities Association) passes only!
- G. Free to senior citizens (62 or over).
- H. Free to cheerleaders, pep club and drill team members in uniform.
- I. Free to student body officers with pass. Officer only, no partners. Sweaters must be worn.
- J. Free to children under five years of age, accompanied by a parent.
- K. Tickets will be sold at varsity football games, and boys and girls varsity basketball games as 4:30 p.m. , with the **exception** of games played at Cottonwood High School. Ticket sales for games played at Cottonwood High School will begin at 3:30 p.m.
- L. Tickets will be sold throughout the full game. No one will be admitted without a ticket or a pass.
- M. When admission is charged for **region tournaments**, the cost will be \$4.00 for students, \$5.00 for adults, and \$20.00 for a family pass (immediate family only) per day – limit six (2 adults, 4 children – ALL must be present to enter).
- N. All those admitted to any activities are required to wear appropriate clothing. Shirts must be worn at all times. No body painting will be allowed.

2. Supervision of Region Activities, Tournaments and Meets

- A. Any school hosting a region tournament or dual competition activity is responsible for providing adequate administrative supervision for the activity.
- B. The host school must have two school administrators at home varsity football and boy's varsity basketball games. Visiting teams must have an administrator and one other school official. These people are to meet prior to the game and work out supervisory details. They are also to stay following the end of the event until the crowds have dispersed.
- C. Although it is the responsibility of the chairman of each individual activity to see that region tournaments and meets are planned and well organized, it is the responsibility of the host school to provide adequate general supervision for the activity. If the host school is not the school of the chairman, there should be a clear understanding between the activity chairman and the host principal regarding the activity. In any case, the host school must provide general supervision for activities taking place in that school. Provide police and administrative supervision at the events and in the parking lots and possible trouble spots as identified by the local school plan.
- D. School administrators who are present at games agree to take immediate, definitive action towards disruptive or unsportsmanlike students or fans.

- E. No sitting or standing on the front rows in basketball.
- F. The host school will clearly define seating areas for both home and visiting students. These areas should accommodate bands and pep clubs as well as the general student body.
- G. If problems of a violent nature occur at any region site as a result of a school's failure to follow these recommended procedures or to provide proper supervision, the Region Board of Managers will take restrictive action against the offending school.

3. Accommodations for Visiting Teams

Dressing rooms should be appropriately prepared for visiting teams with a clean area, lockers, showers, taping tables and chalkboards. Towels will not be furnished to visiting teams by the host school. Visiting teams must bring their own towels if they desire to use them. All dressing room facilities must be left clean and orderly. The visiting head coach will check facilities prior to departure. If a head coach receives a key to dressing room facilities from the home school, the key should be returned to the home school's head coach or designee. LOCKER ROOMS SHOULD BE SECURED AND LOCKED AT ALL TIMES.

4. Rules for Region 6 Tournaments

All Region 6 tournaments will follow the same rules as UHSAA state rules. Approved expenses will be submitted to the Region 6 Board of Managers for payment.

5. Officials

Host schools should provide for someone to meet officials and show them to their dressing rooms both before and after any event. Any misconduct of officials, including failure to show or tardiness is to be reported to the Arbiter in charge of the involved activity. A detailed report including names and improper conduct shall be submitted in writing to the Region 6 Board of Managers, the UHSAA office, and the arbiter involved.

6. Policies Relating to Student Behavior at Region 6 Activities

A. Bands & Drums:

- (1) A pep band will be provided by the host school only. During basketball games, pep bands are to play during regulation time-outs, quarters and half-times only. An advisor must always be present if a band is to perform.
- (2) Drums are to be used only to play with the band, as part of an organized cheer, and to be part of the pep club's marching activities. Drums and any other instruments are not to be used indiscriminately as noisemakers or for drum rolls or instrumental fanfare after each basket.

B. Student Body Officers:

Student Body Officers are expected to demonstrate good sportsmanship and to welcome visiting officers to their school. Student Officers should be easily identifiable (sweaters, shirts, etc.) and available to help make interscholastic activities safe and successful.

C. Cheerleaders:

- (1) Cheerleaders of the host school should initiate a meeting with the guest cheerleaders immediately before the game. The two groups should work cooperatively together during the game. At basketball games, cheerleaders will occupy the space behind the basket closest to their student body. Cheers or songs which are derogatory or insulting are not to be used. Cheers must be under the direction of official school cheerleaders and song leaders.
- (2) All stunts and pyramids must be in accordance with risk management policies.

- (3) No children are to be used in cheerleading or pep club activities. Separate half-time activities are to be approved by the principal.
- (4) Cheerleaders should encourage good sportsmanship at all times. Each student body is to exhibit good sportsmanship. The administration and advisors are, in the interest of proper education, to stress positive sportsmanship and do all in their power to eliminate booing, catcalls, or unsportsmanlike behavior. All group cheering must be under the direction of the cheerleaders and must not be derogatory or obscene.
- (5) Cheerleaders and/or mascots are to refrain from conducting cheers or stunts during foul pitching.
- (6) Megaphones may be used by cheerleaders only at football games, and only for communicating with the cheering section. Megaphones may not be used at basketball games.
- (7) No electronic cheering methods will be allowed.
- (8) A supervisor must be present when cheerleaders perform.
- (9) The cheerleading and team members must attend the Utah School Board's Risk Management Clinic in the spring.

D. Pep Clubs and/or Drill Teams:

- (1) The officers of the host pep club will welcome the visiting pep club.
- (2) The host school will reserve seating arrangements for pep clubs.
- (3) Pep club will be seated close to the floor by the cheerleaders.

E. Pre-game, Half-time, and Post-game Activities:

- (1) The starting line-up may be introduced prior to the activity. A well-planned flag ceremony may be presented.
- (2) All activity should come to a halt immediately when the flag ceremony begins. Head gear should be removed. Activity should remain suspended until flag ceremony is over. Starting line-ups may be introduced following the flag ceremony. All pre-game activities must be concluded before the official time of the event.
- (3) The announcer should call everyone to attention as the flag enters. The announcer should be objective and impartial announcing a game.
- (4) Football half-time: Half-time entertainment has ten minutes which includes time to get on and off the field. Exceptions can be made by mutual agreement for special occasions.
- (5) Basketball half-time: Maximum of seven minutes for half-time entertainment which includes time to get on and off the floor. Exceptions can be made for special occasions.
- (6) The host school pep club or drill team may use pom-poms if the floor is swept after each use, or at the earliest convenient time.
- (7) A supervisor must be present when student groups perform.
- (8) Coaches are responsible for the conduct of their athletes. No activity will be conducted to belittle or humiliate opponents, including organized post-game demonstrations on the floor, field or in the stands. Teams will leave the field or floor immediately after the game ends. Infractions will be referred to the Region 6 Board of Managers.
- (9) No outside vendors selling at Region contests.
- (10) Any senior recognition at end of season cannot delay start of game.
- (11) There should be no post game demonstrations by either team on the floor/field at the end of the game until the visiting team has left the floor/field. Any and all activities must have the approval of the school administration.

F. Spectator Conduct/Sportsmanship:

- (1) Encourage student groups to initiate sportsmanlike activities during the seasons.
- (2) Other than authorized spirit groups (cheerleaders, pep club, drill team), no spectators will be allowed on the field or floor during game time, between quarters, half-time or post game. (Until visiting team exits the floor/field).

- (3) No spectator or cheerleader is permitted to have noisemakers such as bells, sirens, horns, drums, and megaphones. Refer to page 46 of the UHSAA Handbook.
- (4) The throwing of any objects, including confetti, torn paper scraps, crepe paper, toilet tissue, etc., is not allowed.
- (5) Visiting schools are not to conduct any type of post-game activities.
- (6) The use of negative or insulting chants are not to be used.
- (7) For reasons of student safety and I.D. purposes, students will not be allowed to have any body paint on any area of the body except on the face. All other body painting is prohibited. The school administration is responsible to enforce this rule.
- (8) All laser pens are prohibited.
- (9) "Region VI Spectator Support Items" - Please refer to page 49 in USHAA Handbook

G. Banners and Signs:

- (1) No negative banner or posters of any nature will be displayed in the area of competition. A sign welcoming the visiting team is encouraged.
- (2) A sign of a positive nature on the football field at half-time for the home teams to run through will be allowed.
- (3) All banners will be used by the Cheerleaders only.
- (4) No spectator banners or signs.
- (5) Each school may have one School Banner at the Region Championship Meet. The maximum size for this banner being 5' X 8'. No other signs or banners will be allowed at Region site.

7. UHSAA Sportsmanship Policy

Sportsmanship Conduct:

- (1) INTRODUCTION – The effective Utah secondary school should support both an academic program and an activities program. The programs should do more than merely coexist, they should be integrated and support each other in "different" arenas. The concept of "sportsmanship" should be taught, modeled, expected and reinforced in the classroom and in all competitive activities.
- (2) PHILOSOPHY – Activities are an important aspect of the total education process in Utah schools. They provide an arena for participants to grow, to excel, to understand and to value the concepts of SPORTSMANSHIP and teamwork. They are an opportunity for coaches and school staff to teach and model SPORTSMANSHIP, to build school pride, and to increase student/community involvement; which ultimately translates into improved academic performance. Activities are also an opportunity for the community to demonstrate its support for the participants and the school, and to model the concepts of SPORTSMANSHIP for our youth as respected representatives of society. Sportsmanship is good citizenship in action!
- (3) **REGION VI SPORTSMANSHIP CODE OF CONDUCT**
(This statement should be read prior to every Region event)

Ladies and Gentlemen, Region VI and the Granite, Salt Lake, and Murray School Districts are proud to sponsor this Game (event) today between _____ and _____ high schools. It is our mission to encourage the highest in athletic and sportsmanship standards. All players, coaches, students and other spectators are expected to be courteous to their opponents, their fans, and their cheerleaders. To be respectful to officials decision, and to display appreciation for good performance regardless of the team. Enjoy the game (event) and represent your school with dignity.

General Sportsmanship Guidelines

- (4) SPORTSMANSHIP is a way of thinking and behaving. The following sportsmanship policy items are listed below for clarification:
- (5) Be courteous to all (participants, coaches, officials, staff and fans).
- (6) Know the rules. Abide by and respect officials' decisions.
- (7) Win with character and lose with dignity.
- (8) Display appreciation for good performance regardless of the team.
- (9) Exercise self-control and reflect positively upon yourself, the team and the school.
- (10) Permit only positive sportsmanlike behavior to reflect on your school or its activities.
- (11) If flagrant violence occurs in any event in which a Region 6 school is participating, the Region Board of Managers (principals) will review the incident upon request and on a case by case basis to determine possible consequences to participant(s) that are involved. These consequences may result in, but not be limited to, suspension from event(s), suspension for the entire season, and/or may include other consequences as determined by the Region Board of Managers.
- (12) Enforcement Procedure:
 - (a) It is recommended that local boards of education adopt these regulations.
 - (b) It is recommended that schools require enforcement at the local level.
- (13) Region 6 values, and is committed to, good sportsmanship at all athletic contests. In order to promote good sportsmanship in every athletic event, we endorse the following region wide evaluation program to be implemented and recorded for every sports contest during the school year. This program will evaluate coaches, players, and spectators at each game. One administrator, one athletic director and one head coach from each school will evaluate the other school's coaches, players, and spectators. Using a scale of 6 (high) to 1 (low), the evaluators will submit scores, which will then be kept by each athletic director, and reported to the Region 6 Directors at the end of the evaluation period. The schools receiving an overall score of 6 or better will be given a Region 6 Sportsmanship banner that will be placed in a prominent position in the school. The banners are intended to be a visible reminder to every Region 6 school of the necessity and commitment to good sportsmanship emulated by coaches, players and spectators.

C. Unsportsmanlike Ejections and Fighting Policy – Appeals Process

8. EVENTS SCHEDULES

- (1) All Region 6 regularly scheduled events constitute a contract between schools. A breach of contract will result in a penalty as determined by the Region 6 Board of Managers in keeping with the UHSAA constitution. This will result in a fine of one hundred dollars payable to the region board, plus reimbursement for the cost of any officials.
- (2) Any change of dates made after the printing of the Region 6 Manual must be approved by the Region Board of Managers at least one week before the activity was originally scheduled unless a change is forced by justified conflict.
- (3) All invitational meets, matches or tournaments must be approved by the UHSAA thirty days prior to the activity. Appropriate fines will be assessed against a host school and others who participate in unsanctioned events.

9. MISCELLANEOUS

- (1) Awards are to be given according to the published Region 6 format. No additional awards will be allowed unless pre-approved by the Board of Managers.
- (2) All personnel on the sidelines at any games will be monitored and controlled by the school administration and police officers.

10. CHANGE OF TIME AND DATE

Both principals are to agree to the change before a change can occur. If the Board of Managers agrees on a change of time and date of an activity, the host school must notify arbiter of the change in time for him to notify the officials. Host school or Region 6 school in practice games outside of Region 6 must also notify other Region 6 schools. All officials (Varsity, J.V., Sophomore and Freshman) will be arbitrated by UHSAA. Call changes to UHSAA offices. All costs associated with changing the time and date will be incurred by the school requesting the change.

11. GAME STARTING TIMES AND PARTICIPANT REGULATIONS

No sports activity may begin before 3:30 p.m., unless approved by Board of Managers. However varsity football may not start before 4:00 p.m. until October 1. Thereafter, games may start at 3:30 p.m. Students should not be excused from class to get ready for any sports activity prior to the close of school. Any exception must be approved by the Region Board of Managers.

12. TIES OF STANDING

The tie-breaking procedure will be used for the following team sports: Baseball, Boys Basketball, Girls Basketball, Football, Boys Soccer, Girls Soccer, Softball and Volleyball.

If the tie does not involve a berth in the State Tournament play-offs, but involves only seeding in the playoffs between two or more teams, the tie will be broken in the following manner:

- A. Head to head league competition among the tied teams will be the first criteria used to determine seeding for the State Tournament Playoffs.
- B. If the tie or seeding cannot be resolved using the above method, the seed will be determined by the tied teams' record against teams with the highest finish in the region. This process will continue down through the region standings until the tie is broken and seeding is determined.
- C. If a tie still exists, a coin flip will determine placement/seeding.

If a tie occurs among teams involving a berth in the state tournament playoffs, the tie will be broken by a play-off between the tied teams. The play-off will be played on a neutral site agreeable to all schools involved, on a day and time agreeable to all schools involved.

If the tie is among more than two schools involving a berth in the State Tournament play-offs, the following procedure will occur: An odd-man-out coin flip will determine which schools will draw the bye, the odd man having the bye. The other two teams will play, the loser being eliminated and the winner going on to play the team that drew the bye. The winner of that game earns the first vacant berth. The play-off games for football will be half the length of a regular game.

13. MORATORIUM

A \$300.00 fine, not to be paid by the school, may be assessed to the coach of any team that is in violation of the designated days for moratorium of practice and play. This includes UHSAA sanctions.

14. FINE FOR VIOLATIONS

A fine of \$250.00 may be assessed for a violation of region rules as determined by the Region 6 Board of Managers.

15. SEEDING MEETINGS OR OTHER MEETINGS

Any expenses that are expected to be paid by Region 6 should be approved by the Board of Managers.

16. ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility rules for Region 6 will be determined by the Utah High School Athletic Association By-Laws:

To participate in any USHAA Region VI or State interscholastic competition, an individual must be a full-time student in the school he/she has established eligibility. No student shall be eligible to represent his/her school if he/she is failing more than one subject or has a GPA of less than 2.0. Where a student has failed to meet the minimum requirements set forth above, he/she shall also be ineligible for participation in USHAA or Region III activities in the succeeding grading period. Incompletes are computed as F's for eligibility.

- a. No student who is ineligible for a grading period should represent the school in any pre-season or practice contests with varsity, junior varsity, sophomore or freshman teams.
- b. The date report card documents are posted officially by the school becomes the date which the scholastic rule is applied.
- c. An incomplete is considered a failure until it is made up.
- d. The final grading period is defined as the date report cards are posted by the school for the last grading period of the school year.
- e. A student enters upon high school work when he/she enters the 9th grade regardless of whether the 9th grade is in the high school or a separate junior high school. This means that all 9th or 10th grade students must not have failed more than one class the previous grading period and have a GPA 2.0 or higher.
- f. For the purpose of fall sports eligibility, classes taken during the summer do not constitute the previous term.
- g. The word represent shall be defined below. Any violator of the Scholastic Eligibility By-laws shall not:
 - i. be in uniform on competition night.
 - ii. warm-up with the team.
 - iii. sit on the bench with the team.
 - iv. be listed on the program roster.
 - v. be introduced as a member of the team.

The above student/participant may, however, continue to practice with his/her team upon approval of the school administration.
 - vi. TA letter grades with the exception of failing grades will not be calculated as part of a student's GPA in determining eligibility.
- h. Eligibility – refer to UHSAA Handbook.

17. COACHES

- A. Coaching behavior on the bench is reflected in student behavior. It is the responsibility of the principal to direct the coaching staff to be examples of good sportsmanship at all times.
- B. Coaches are not to exert undue influence on officials before, during or after any contest. Any complaints or protests are to be made through the principal of the school.

18. NUMBER OF GAMES

Teams which exceed the number of games allowed in any season will forfeit from their region schedule the number of games exceeding the limit. Forfeited game may be subtracted from the region win/loss record of the offending school. For each extra game, one win may be subtracted from record and one loss may be added. Other sanctions may be taken by the Region 6 Board of Managers.

19. DUTIES OF REGION CHAIRPERSONS

- A. Conduct all meetings pertinent to respective activity.
- B. Coordinate and manage all region competitions and tournaments of respective activity.
- C. Select and honor respective all-region teams where applicable.
- D. Be direct liaison to Region Board of Managers.
- E. Be responsible for all awards, trophies, medals, etc., pertinent to respective activity.
- F. Region meeting to select all region teams should meet within two weeks of the conclusion of the activity.

20. FAILURE TO PARTICIPATE

The failure of a team to participate in a scheduled contest without prior mutual consent and Board of Managers approval at all levels, including Varsity, J.V., Soph., etc., will result in a fine assessed by the Board of Managers, plus the cost of any officials etc. to the affected schools.

21. UNDUE INFLUENCE RULE, VIOLATION

- a. If there is clear evidence that a coach has violated Article 1, Section 9 of the USHAA Manual he/she will appear before the Region Board of Managers and may be under the direction of the UHSAA receive any or all of the following for the first violation:
 - i. A letter of reprimand.
 - ii. Suspension
 - iii. Fine
- b. If it is determined a coach has violated the undue influence rule a second time, the coach will be suspended a minimum of three contests or one- half of the remaining region schedule. (Whichever is greater).
- c. A third violation will mean suspension for the remainder of the current season.

22. PENALTIES

Region VI, upon having knowledge of an infraction of a rule or policy in assessing penalties may initiate action. Region VI may consider any of the following:

- a. Forfeiture of contests because of rules violation, etc.
- b. Reprimand by official letter to individual(s) and/or school in regard to the offense committed with a warning to correct situation(s).
- c. Probation of individual(s) and/or school by official letter advising parties of the probationary status and the conditions of the probation.
- d. Restriction which would restrict individual(s) and/or school in region, group or state activities
- e. Suspension would result in dropping the school from membership in Region activities for a specific time period.
- f. Fines to the coach, principal and/or school may be assessed.

All penalties imposed by the Region Board of Managers are final.

1. There will be four (4) 9-hole dual matches and five (5) 18-hole region tournaments. The dual matches will count as one region tournament. Points for the five region tournaments will be according to the following scoring:

The team with the most points will be declared Region VI Champion. In case of a tie After the fifth 18-hole tournament, a two-hole playoff will be conducted to determine the team champion.
2. Dual matches will start at 3:00 p.m. at designated home courses. Region tournaments will start as late as possible (shot gun starts will be requested.)
3. In case of a tie for the state berth, a sudden death playoff will be held.
4. Individual medals will be given to the ten (10) players with the lowest scores in the four 18-hole region tournaments.
5. No caddie is to be used by the golfers.
6. Electric carts are not to be used by the players. Exceptions will be determined by the coach's representative and region golf chairperson.
7. All coaches are responsible to see that their players are dressed in appropriate golfing attire and comply with local course rules.
8. Players must attend school the day of scheduled dual matches and tournaments to be eligible for play that day.
9. Play will be governed by the U.G.H.A. rules and local course rules, stroke play, proper golf conduct, etiquette and Region VI sportsmanship code.
10. Each school will be responsible to schedule their own rules meeting.
11. Men-Blue Tee, Women-White Tee (Dual & Region Matches)
12. Team shirts with a collar and a team logo are highly recommended.
13. Rained-out meets will be rescheduled at the convenience of the golf courses. In the event of tournament cancellation, due to inclement weather, the following U.S.G.A. rules will apply:
 - A. When less than 50% of the field completes or could complete play on the scheduled day – cancel the round.
 - B. When more than 50% of the field completes or could complete play on the scheduled day suspend play temporarily until the next suitable time for resumption.
14. The school hosting the match will be in charge of having individual. Scorecards, hole assignments, and all other administrative duties completed.
15. Parents may not give any advice to players while on the golf course.

3. All students who participate during instrumental music festivals, except solo accompanists, must be members in good standing of their school's instrumental music program (See UHSAA Handbook, Music Rules and Regulations, Section 1, Part B)

4. All large ensemble members are expected to be audience participants for at least two performances before or after their own performance. Music educators are encouraged to enforce this guideline through their own policies.

5. Each school may submit unlimited entries to the Solo and Ensemble Festival. However, entries beyond twenty (20) should be prioritized to allow each school adequate representation.

6. Certificates supplied by the Region will be awarded for all "Superior" ratings at all festivals. Additional. Certificates/awards may be presented to outstanding groups, sections, or individuals at the discretion of the festival adjudicators (i.e. outstanding rhythm section or soloist for Jazz Band Festival).

 - Varsity games will be best out of 5 games and the 5th game will be played to 15 points.
4. Rules outlined by the Utah High School activities Association will be followed.
5. Region Championship trophy will be awarded to the winning team.
6. The all-Region Team will be selected by the coaches at the end of the season. The meeting will be Tuesday Nov. 1, 2005 at West High School at 6:00 p.m. MVP and 6 member 1st Team and player form each team on the 2nd Team.
7. Game warm-up schedules:

Sophomore/JV/Varsity: State Tournament format
8. Tie breaker: Region rules will be used.
9. Winning coach calls in scores.
10. Official Line Judges, one from each team, must be provided for the Varsity Game.
11. The libero position has been added for the 2006-07 school year. States that wish to use the position for the 2005-06 school year may begin using the libero for the coming year. The position will include the following rules:
 - a) The libero must be designated for each game if a coach chooses to use one, and must be marked on the line up sheet prior to the game.
 - b) You may only use one libero for each game of the match.
 - c) The libero may only enter game after starting lineup has been checked. This means she may enter prior to the first serve.
 - d) Only one libero replacement per dead ball.
 - e) Libero replacements are not counted as substitutions.
 - f) The libero does not have to be used, by may.
 - g) Libero must enter and exit game between the attack line and the endline.
 - h) Libero may be a captain.
 - i) Libero may not serve.
 - j) Libero may be used as an exceptional substitution for an injured player if not other legal substitutes are available.
 - k) Libero may not be used as a substitute for a disqualified Teammate.
 - l) Libero can not block or attempt to block.
 - m) If a libero sets the ball using overhand finger action while in front of the attack line extended, any teammate who attacks that ball while it is above the height of the net results in an illegal attack. The libero is not allowed to complete an attack from anywhere if, at the moment of contact, the ball is entirely above the height of the net.
12. Sportsman Award will be determined by coaches at the end of the season.

A. SCALES FOR WEIGH-IN

All scales used in an official weigh-in will be certified annually. Each school is responsible to notify the Utah Department of Weights and Measures. Scales must be certified prior to the beginning of the competition. The home school is responsible to provide a certified scale for weigh-in at all Region Duals.

B. FRESHMAN/SOPHOMORE REGION TOURNAMENT

The host school will determine the entry fee. This could be a per wrestler fee or straight team entry fee. Medals will be awarded to the top four placers. The freshman/sophomore tournament will be held at the school who hosts the varsity tournament the following year. A traveling team trophy will be awarded to the team with the highest team points. All Wrestlers from each school can score points for their team. Each school will be allowed an unrestricted number of entries in each weight class. First place scores 16 points, second place 12 points, third place 9 points, fourth place scores 7 points.

C. REGION TOURNAMENT

Each school will be allowed to enter two wrestlers in each weight class. All wrestlers entered in the Region Tournament will score for the respective schools. Points for team scoring will be awarded according to the rule book for four places, if four or fewer wrestlers qualify for the State Tournament. If more than four places qualify for the State Tournament in any weight, six places will be scored. Byes will be equally distributed among all teams. Medals will be awarded to the top six winners in each weight classification. A team trophy will be awarded to the Region Tournament Team Champion. Two Outstanding Wrestlers and one Region Teach Dual Championship Traveling Trophies will be given at the Region Tournament. The cost of the Dual Team and Outstanding Wrestlers awards will be divided equally among the teams at Region. Host school can determine if they wish to give a Region Coach of the Year plaque, with the cost added to other plaques given.

D. SEEDING FOR REGION TOURNAMENT

- 1) To change any region procedures, a vote of five head coaches is required.
- 2) Varsity wrestlers will be assigned a seed in each weight class. Coaches can consider up to two J.V. wrestlers for a seed, but six out of the eight head coaches must agree the wrestler is deserving of a seed. All non-seeded wrestlers are to drawn in. Seeding for the Region Tournament will be based on the following criteria applied in order.
 - 3) The best wrestlers will be separated. Vote of 5 head coaches is required to determine outcome of majority rule.
 - 4) Best Region Record: The following factors will be considered in determining Region Seeding in the following order:
 - a. Head to head record in Region Dual Meets
 - b. Most Region wins at the weight class
 - c. Overall Region win/loss record

E. MEDALS.

Medals will be awarded to the place winners in each weight classification. A team trophy will be awarded to the Region Tournament Team Champion. Three Outstanding Wrestlers awards will be given and the cost will be split among the teams of the region.
