What is Community Education?

Community Education is a system that provides life-long learning opportunities that engage schools, students, families and the broader community in a process designed to establish and meet educational and community goals.

West High Community Education

The **goal** of West High Community Education is to create and support a nurturing educational environment where students, families and members of the community empower themselves to be successful. This goal is reached through offering classes and activities designed to foster the stabilization of the neighborhood by:

- * integrating classroom and community learning;
- * focusing on learning activities in a variety of settings during the day and evening that supplement the curriculum and relate to the environment in which students live;
- * using neighborhood adults as role models and learning resources;
- * encouraging and providing life-long learning opportunities for neighborhood residents of all ages and abilities;
- * bringing together resources of the Salt Lake School District, the City of Salt Lake, Community Education, and other service providers to create a safe and structured learning environment based on student and community needs.

AFTER SCHOOL

ONE-ON-ONE/SMALL GROUP TUTORING

Is your student in need of academic assistance? Call and schedule a one-on-one session in our Tutor School at 578-8500 x 405. All tutor sessions are to be **pre-paid** at the Community Education Office in room 231 after school. Held in the library.

Students that either do not have a computer at home or do not have Internet access can come to our After-School Open Computer Lab. The computer lab is in room 229 and is available on a first come-first served basis. Students need to show their student ID and sign in to use the lab.

We are authorized by the Salt Lake County Health Department to teach Food Handler classes. Classes are held at: West High School at 241 North 300 West SLC 84103 in the Cafeteria (North Entrance). Please park in the parking lot to the North of the main building. The cafeteria is across the street through the double doors on the lower level.

Classes can now be held at your place of business with a minimum of 30 participants. An off-site fee of \$25.00 applies and advanced payment is required.

COMM. EDUCATION CLASSES

Afternoon and evening non-credit enrichment classes are offered to the community. These classes are offered during three sessions throughout the school year.

The fall session runs approximately from the middle of September to the middle of November.
The winter session runs approximately from the middle of January to the middle of March.
The spring session runs approximately from late March to late May.

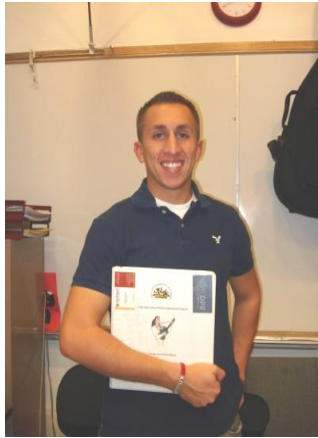
We are always looking to expand the classes we offer to the community. If you have a talent or skill that you would like to share with the community, feel free to write a class proposal for our consideration.

YOUTH ADVOCATE

The student advocate at West is Marie Durazo. The advocate works with students who are at risk for failing or dropping out of school. The advocate monitors referred students' academic performance, attendance, and anything else pertinent to the students' success at West High. The advocate will also help students get into programs that will help them academically and/or socially. Communication with parents, teachers, counselors and other school staff is also an integral part of the service to the students.

Since the advocate works one-on-one with students, it is sometimes necessary to take them out of class for short periods of time. We understand that there will be times when a student cannot be released from a class, and we will always respect the teacher's decision.

If there is a student that you feel will benefit from the help of our Student Advocate, please make a referral either verbally or in writing to Marie Durazo. The advocate is currently only available on Monday and Tuesday.
